
A LIVELY HOME WITH POPS OF TURQUOISE AND YELLOW



Fun in the kitchen

A widened entrance to the kitchen opens up the space and allows for an unrestricted flow of light and air. Tiles of different patterns are used on the floor and the backsplash, creating a unique look that suits the personality of the homeowners. Instead of typical kitchen handles, Marc chose oversized cabinet knobs in turquoise to add a dash of playfulness to this cooking space.



Wall of favourites

The display storage units at the dining area double as a feature wall, serving as a focal point in this open-concept living-dining space. Decked out in cheery shades of yellow, pastel pink and mint green, the wall also showcases the couple's favourite verse from the Bible. A "hanging" bench and a trio of pendant lamps subtly demarcate the dining area in this open space without the need for any walls.



Get refreshed

Two bedrooms were merged to form this spacious master bedroom. The cool shade of turquoise painted on the wall imbues this room with an invigorating sense of calm and freshness. Even the window blinds are in a similar shade, tying the different areas together to form a cohesive zone. On the other side of the room, the washbasin and vanity counter are designed to be separate from en suite toilet and shower so that the space can serve two individuals at a time.



Customised space

The study desk provides a place for the couple to do some work and reading in the privacy of their room. The "floating" effect of the desk – a tabletop suspended from the ceiling – lends a sense of airiness to the space. As requested by the homeowners, Marc incorporated the word 'faith' into the design of the wardrobe using a typeface that gels with the entire interior design of this home.

Designer Yiap Yi Yun combined woody finishes, textured surfaces and strong colours to form the backdrop to this home's extensive collection of toys and action figures. 


Layers of design

In order for the kitchen to be visually connected to the other spaces, glass panels were installed on half-height walls. A sliding door allows the kitchen to be enclosed whenever necessary, to keep cooking smells and fumes away from the rest of the house. Shades of black, white and grey are used on the walls and ceiling to create different layers of depth in this space.




Industrial inspiration

Yi Yun designed the dining room with a forest green wall, drawing attention to a custom-built display shelf that houses the prized toy collection belonging to the homeowner. Being an avid collector of toys and figurines, the homeowner requested for dedicated display areas for him to showcase his collection. In line with the rustic industrial feel of this home, the display shelves were made with wood planks and black metal pipes.



Warm and woody

In the living room, the TV feature wall is clad with dark wood grain laminate in a design that ties in closely with the cabinets in the kitchen. Deviating from the rustic industrial theme, a chesterfield sofa was chosen for the living room, giving this home not just a more classic feel, but also a touch of eclecticism in its design approach.



Storage savvy

Wall-to-wall cabinets ensure that this kitchen contains sufficient storage solutions for the homeowners. While the bottom cabinets are finished in a design that mimics wooden crates, the overhead cabinets are clad in a matt black laminate. The topmost layer of cabinets has an additional finishing that resembles barn doors, creating a rustic atmosphere in this space.
